Our Burrowing Owl Adventure

On February 4th the Kid's Club joined the Red Rock Audubon Society to make homes for the burrowing owls which are native to this area. Burrowing owls (Athene cunicularia) don't make their own burrows. They take over mole or other animal burrows and make them their own Because of the development in the area these adorable creatures were being displaced. A local doctor, Michael Braunstein, knowing there were nests on a property that was for sale, purchased the property and made it a sanctuary.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife helped sponsor the event. They had scopes and binocular for the children to view the owls and also provided barn owl pellets for the children to dissect with identification sheets to place the bones they found in the pellets.

We scoured the area; picking up trash, old pipes and construction material, etc. Then we placed man-made burrows in the pre-dug holes. Lastly we shoveled and raked the rocks and soil over the shelter and air duct which was open at the surface to allow ventilation.

Adults and children alike were thrilled to see the small owls in their natural habitat. It was rewarding to know our efforts could help preserve and protect the burrowing owls. It was a wonderful experience and a beautiful day! Thank you Jim and Mary Switalla for inviting us.




