PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

From Sue Moore

Greetings Rock Hounds and Lapidary Enthusiasts:

The hot weather is here so our outings are limited in the local area. I cannot caution you enough about the need to be prepared when going into the desert during these months. Review the field trip suggestions and recommendations shown on our website to ensure a safe trip. Don't forget to alert a friend or neighbor of your plan so they can call out the cavalry if you don't check in on time. Avoid going out alone. If there is a second vehicle, they can go for help. Summer in Las Vegas is a good time to work on your lapidary projects in our air conditioned shop.

Speaking of the shop, we have a new 8 inch flat lap coming from Kingsley North. I want to take this opportunity to go over the best way to use this new equipment, as I have one in my home shop. Let's start with your basic slab, with the intention of designing the cabochon of your choice. Mark out your design and cut within 1 mm of your mark line. Then, take your rough shape to the flat lap and, using the coarsest grit disc, grind down to your design line. You need to hold tight to your shape as a dropped piece will shoot off to the edge and either go under the guard or fly off and break. This is not what you want to happen. Next, grind the front side down at a 45 degree angle to save time on the Cab King. You are now ready to move on to the Cab King for the first wheel to complete the grinding and polishing. My advice to all users is to order your personal 8 inch flat lap disc and keep it with your "shop stuff". That way you will always have a perfect disc to use.

Field Trip Report on Delta, Utah:

The Club went to Delta, Utah, on Memorial Day Weekend, for a fun and productive trip. Chops and Gary had arrived on Tuesday and reconnoitered the town. Bill and I arrived on Wednesday, along with Cindy Allison, and set up our camps at the Antelope RV Park and were immediately advised to see the super geodes at the ACE Hardware. Thursday morning saw us all at the aforementioned ACE Hardware where we purchased awesome, large geodes for a bargain price of \$8.00 for a 12 inch geode half. Cindy Allison and I toured the Great Basin Museum and the Topaz Museum. The Topaz Museum is fairly new and consists of art created by the Japanese artists interned during World War II. Their exhibit is very amazing. They had a map to the section of land, which was the actual site of the Topaz internment facility and we drove out and took the self-guided tour.

On Friday, the group went south from Delta to the Sunstone collecting area, where we scrambled about collecting surface sunstones. Upon reflection, we would have been well advised to bring a bucket and classifier to shovel in surface material and pick out the larger stones. Oh well, next time. Next, we continued south to the Black Rock Desert for obsidian. The hillside of the collecting area had huge boulders and Al and Toni won the prize for largest snowflake obsidian rock ever collected. It took them 2 days to devise a way to get it into their truck.

Saturday took us to the U-Dig Trilobites, west of Delta, and a day of collecting in the rain. What a group of troopers! The rain did not stop us. We developed a strategy of collecting rocks and taking them under the shelter to split and search for the trilobites. We spent 3 hours collecting and returned to Delta, for another run at the ACE Hardware, where I bought 2 lounge chairs on sale.

Sunday was the big day for Topaz Mountain and Dugway Geodes. We drove north to Topaz Mountain and arrived ready to conquer the world. The main group stayed on the South side of the mountain and the rest drove around to the West for a trek into the back side. After 2 hours of hammering and chipping we talked it over and decided to skip Dugway Geodes, as it was raining over there (and we had purchased geodes from ACE Hardware) and go for agate. We collected in 2 different sites and returned to Delta.

Monday, we went south again and the main group went to the obsidian pits for gold sheen, mahogany and snowflake obsidian. A second group, consisting of Bill Kogan, Cindy Allison, and Don Evans, continued on to Black Rock/Garrison Road in search for the site of the Zebra Rock. After a couple of hours, the main group continued on to follow the Zebra Rock group, as they texted that the mother lode had been located. We traveled west 38 miles and caught up with Bill Kogan and Cindy Allison (Don Evans had already loaded up and left to return to Las Vegas) and followed them to the collecting area. We were very excited about the quality of the rock and stayed on site for around 1 hour, then continued north past Crystal Peak and went back to Delta via Hwy 6/50. *(See pages 7 - 8 for photos)*

KIDS CLUB / EDUCATION ACTIVITIES




Polymer clay class will be held June 29th from 2-5 PM, and will be making feathers. Contact Lorrilee Stackhouse at 702-631-5291 for more information.
