

SNGMS Board Meeting Minutes for 10/7/2024

On October 7th, 2024, the regular Board of Directors meeting of the Southern Nevada Gem and Mineral Society was called to order at the Eagles' Lodge at 4:07 PM by the President. All Board members except the Parliamentarian were present. The pledge of allegiance to the flag was recited.

Minutes: The minutes of the September 9th, 2024, meeting were approved as read.

Ongoing Business

Treasurers Report: Balance of the checking account as of September 30th was \$25,789, an increase of \$2,811 from the previous month, primarily due to receipt of Viva Las Vegas Rocks! show booth rental fees and sale of Award Banquet tickets. The investments balance is \$127,644, an increase of \$83.

The Treasurer presented information on rental of the shop space next to the SNGMS Lapidary Shop. This would almost double our shop expenses and would require a major increase in revenue to support it. It will be brought up at the general meeting and interested members will be able to sign up to attend a meeting on this issue.

SNGMS Lapidary Shop Report: Everything at the Shop is in working order.

Viva Las Vegas Rocks! Show: Orville Wiemers reported the booths are sold out and the floor plan is complete. Advertising is ongoing and tickets are available through Eventbrite.

Spotlight on Chrysoprase

"Chrysoprase" is from the Greek words for green gold. Chrysoprase is the most valuable form of chalcedony. It is usually bright green, but the color varies from greenish-blue to deep green. Most green gemstones owe their color to chromium or vanadium, but chrysoprase gets its color from nickel. It is evenly colored and hard enough to make good cabochons. Chrysoprase is mined in Australia, Tanzania, Brazil, and Poland.

Chrysoprase was quite admired in the 1980s and is now having a comeback due to the popularity of Charli XCX's "brat" album cover according to the New York Times. Its popularity may grow because some jewelers and lapidarists are substituting chrysoprase for malachite since malachite can be an irritant when its dust is inhaled.

Unearthing History: The Remarkable Discovery of the Giant Ground Sloth in Southern Nevada Editorial by Sonya Edwards

In an extraordinary chapter of Southern Nevada's paleontological history, SNGMS members made a groundbreaking discovery: the first Giant Ground Sloth skeleton in the region. This remarkable find, unearthed by LaRae Bringhurst and Doris Currington near Sloan, adds a significant piece to the puzzle of prehistoric life in Nevada.

The remains belong to the Devil Peak Shasta Ground Sloth (Nothrotheriops shastensis), and this skeleton is one of the most complete specimens of its kind ever found. Today, a detailed replica of this ancient creature can be admired at the Nevada State Museum at the Springs Preserve, inviting visitors to step back in time and explore the life of these fascinating mammals.




The study surrounding the Devil Peak sloth aims to delve deeper into the morphology of Nothrotheriops shastensis. By comparing its dimensions with those of the Aden Crater sloth—the only other complete skeleton known of this species—researchers hope to paint a clearer picture of these prehistoric giants. Radiocarbon dating of associated eggshells suggests the Devil Peak sloth lived around 32,000 years ago, making it a remarkable link to the past.

In a meticulous analysis, various dimensions were measured, including both humeri, one radius, both ulnae, the pelvis, both patellae, and one tibia. While many bones of the Devil Peak skeleton are smaller than those of the famous La Brea

specimens, they closely match the size of the Aden Crater sloth. Intriguingly, the pelvis of the Devil Peak sloth is considerably larger than that of its Aden Crater counterpart, leading researchers to hypothesize that the Devil Peak sloth was likely a female adult.

This discovery not only enriches our understanding of prehistoric fauna in Southern Nevada but also highlights the invaluable contributions of local enthusiasts like Bringhurst and Currington. Their dedication continues to inspire curiosity and appreciation for the rich geological and paleontological heritage of the region. The replica of the Giant Ground Sloth at the Nevada State Museum serves as a reminder of the incredible stories hidden beneath our feet, waiting to be uncovered.







SNGMS Life Time Member Bernada (Bernie) French

(October 18, 1905 - September 21, 1994)

Bernada Jordan was born in Missouri in 1905. Sometime between 1925 and 1929, Bernada married Maurice E. Clapp, a retail tire merchant, and moved to California. The Clapps operated a tire business, and by 1940 they were manufacturing rubber products. Their marriage ended and Bernada was living in Las Vegas, Nevada, when she remarried. Her new husband wanted to move to Alaska, so they did. Bernada hated Alaska, and moved back to Las Vegas. Bernada's third and final attempt at marriage was in September 1957 to Lester French, but that marriage also ended.

Bernada said she had seven jobs she could remember and three husbands she'd like to forget!, explaining "I had a few

boyfriends after that. It's easier to just get rid of 'em without having to go through a divorce." She rented rooms in her home to women (mostly) who were waiting to finish their six-week divorce in Nevada. She rented a room on weekends to a Nevada Test Site geologist, Dr. Isaac Winograd, who took Bernada and her renters into the desert on rock expeditions. As early as 1966, Bernada joined the Clark County Gem Collectors (CCGC), an ancestor of the SNGMS.

In 1973, Bernarda created the UNLV Bernada E. French Scholarship in Geology. The scholarships are awarded annually as \$1000 grants.

Bernada wrote articles for a variety of gem and mineral magazines. She authored two published books, *Jewelry Craft Made Easy* and *Pebble Pets and Rock Rascals*. The books are still available on Amazon!

Mineral Musings Turquoise Grading

There have been efforts to create an objective form of turquoise grading. An early attempt was made by Robert Biesecker in 1977. Dennis June, a former art gallery owner in Scottsdale, Arizona, led an unsuccessful grading effort on Facebook. Mike Ryan proposed a grading method in 2015 which also failed. Many collectors and consumers favor development of a grading method. Miners and dealers have been opposed, presumably because they worry about a drop in price for their stones.

Jacob Lowry and his father, Joe Dan Lowry have been developing a turquoise grading system over the past five years. The Lowrys operate the Turquoise Museum in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

For diamonds, the Four Cs (color, clarity, cut and carat weight) are the standard for determining gem quality. For turquoise, there are varying opinions. Turquoise can be monochromatic or variegated, clear or spider-webbed. Preferences about what makes the best stones are not standard. Sometimes the source and availability of a stone come into play. There are no widely accepted standards to determine what makes one turquoise stone better than another.

The Lowrys' proposed grading system focuses on natural, untreated turquoise. Color is the most important factor, followed by the presence or the absence of matrix. Then there is the quality known as "zat," a kind of wow factor. Jacob Lowry defines zat as "the contrast of the stone and the 'pop' of the stone. If you put two stones on a solid background, one will have more vibrancy and one will fade into the background. If you take the highest grade turquoise into the sunlight, you can see into the stone. That's part of what 'zat' is."

The Lowrys have compiled 24 master sets of turquoise stones related to color, matrix and zat, totaling 192 stones. Their idea is to compare a stone to the master set with the closest hues, and score it for color. The same process would then be followed with the master sets of turquoise for matrix and zat.

Once a stone has a numerical score based on color, matrix, and zat, a grader would make note of other factors that do not affect grade, but might affect value, such as cut, carat weight and provenance.

Plans are underway to photograph the master sets so more graders will have access to them. The Lowrys expect to offer classes on the grading system in addition to the courses they currently offer on turquoise identification.
