

Shop Talk by Del Walkenshaw


Bruce Martin and I were talking at the shop the other day and he mentioned harnesses of stones, in particular the Absolute Hardness. I knew the Mohs scale but never thought much about the range of differences between the Mohs 1 though 10. And as things happen I bumped into Scott and Ananaka at the shop and she asked if we could do a Mohs Hardness table. Great minds! View the chart on page 7 and see the true hardness difference. For example, Calcite is three times harder than Gypsum and Diamond is 4 times harder than Corundum, not just one number difference, i.e., Mohs 10 verses 9. Interesting.

National Park Senior Pass Price Increase (Thanks to Johnny Miller for this information)

Senior Pass Price Increase: Effective <u>August the 28th, 2017</u> the price of the America The Beautiful-National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Senior Pass will increase from \$10.00 to \$80.00. This increase is the first since 1994. The additional revenue will be used enhance the visitors' experience in the parks. The price increase is a result of Centennial Liegislation P. L. 114-289 passed by the U.S. Congress on December 19,2016.





After, Michael Kisner and I will distribute arrowheads to the 300 boys in attendance. Thanks to the members who helped put the fact sheet and arrowheads in a plastic bags for hand outs. Mike will explain and demonstrate the knapping process. It should be a fun evening of sharing and learning.



Arrowheads

Present day arrowheads are hand carved from natural minerals, such as, obsidian, chert, flint and jasper. Arrowheads tell about the native Americans culture that made them and therefore are of historical interest. They are made by a process called knapping which is chipping rocks by hammering with bone, other rocks or tools into sharp fragments to be used as tools.

Classes

<u>Wire wrapping</u>, led by Peggy Sue Moore or Scott Edwards , meets on most Mondays (except for the General Meeting night). Hours for the class are 5 - 8 PM. The fee is \$5.00 for the shop and \$1.00 pattern fee.

At this time there are no beading classes scheduled.

<u>Silver Smithing</u> meets every Tuesday at 5 PM. Still need a volunteer for this class. The class is suitable for beginners, and also for intermediate to advanced students.

<u>Faceting classes will be changing.</u> Upon the arrival of the new supplies, the faceting classes will be held from 10 to noon on two Saturdays a month. Please contact Peggy Sue Moore in advance to see if a machine is available. If you use club machines they are \$5 an hour, no class fee.

Scott Edwards is teaching **Metalsmithing and Miscellaneous Lapidary Arts** every Saturday from 8-10.

Another knapping session will be organized. Watch for the announcement. The contact is Michael Kisner, (702) 285-2032.

Wire wrapping, metal smithing, flint knapping, and silver smithing have a very modest donation of \$5.00 per session, that goes to the club. Faceting is \$5.00 an hour, the cost of faceting machine use, or a flat \$5.00 if you use your own machine. Other class donations may vary, depending on what is included in the class. All donations go to SNGMS, all instructors volunteer their time and expertise to help extend the knowledge of our members.
